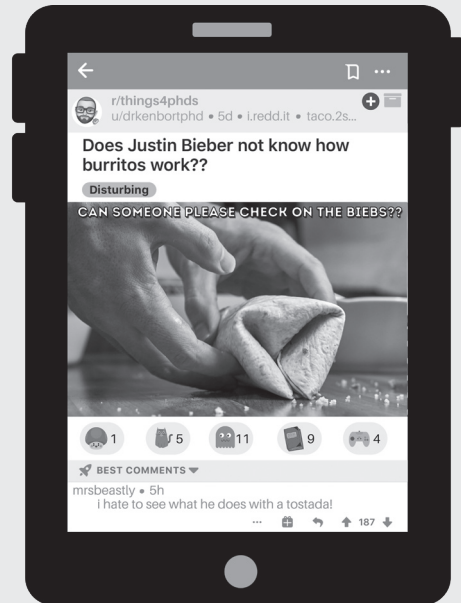


## The case of . . . The Bogus Burrito!

- **Triggers:** How does this information make you feel about the people involved? Does that play a role in making you want to like/share it?
- **Access:** Does the app being used make it easier or more difficult to determine credibility?
- **Forensics:** Are there clues in the information itself that can help to determine credibility?
- **Motives:** If this story turns out to be fake, what kind of person would create/spread it?
